PROGRAMME FOR 1982

a) SATURDAY 20TH FEBRUARY 1982 2.30 p.m. LAVENHAM GUILDHALL, OLD CHAPEL

DR.S.M.WALTERS, director of the UNIVERSITY BOTANIC GARDENS, CAMBRIDGE, will give an illustrated talk on "Botanic Gardens and Conservation".

Please bring contributions for tea and also for the Plant Stall.

b) SATURDAY 20TH MARCH 1982, 2.30 p.m. A visit to NOTCUTT'S PROPOGATION

DEPARTMENT AT WOODBRIDGE. This Unit is the biggest in the country for trees and shrubs and was built in 1979. MR.IVAN DICKINGS, a member of our Group who is in charge of the unit will give an explanatory talk before taking us around the centre to see bench grafting, seed sowing, and conifer cuttings under mist propogation.

Directions to the Unit:- Coming from Ipswich on the A12 to Woodbridge and once past Martlesham "Red Lion" take the first right hand turn into Sandy Lane by Spencers Garage. Continue down Sandy Lane and the Propogation Unit is just past the railway bridge on the right.

If the turning on the A12 is missed, continue on the A12, under the railway bridge, turn right to Woodbridge then take the first right into California. At the end of California turn right again which brings you into Sandy Lane. The Propogation Unit is about 200 yards down the road on the left hand side.

There will be facilities for tea and for our own Plant Stall. Please bring contributions for both.

c) SATURDAY 24TH APRIL, 1982 at 3.00 P.M. MR.A.J.BROWN'S GARDEN, "Horseshoes" Little Thetford, Nr.Ely, Cambs.

The Group last visited this garden of raised beds and alpines when it was in an early state of development in 1976.

Little Thetford is situated on the A10 Cambridge to Ely Road, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Ely – a pink thatched house just past the Church. There is a possibility we may also be able to visit another nearby place of about $3\frac{1}{2}$ acres of landscaped garden.

There will be a plant stall and arrangements for tea, so please bring a contribution as usual.

Chequers at Boxford needs no introduction as we have visited here many times; for the benefit of new members, however, Chequers is situated in the centre of the Village opposite the Church. There will, as always be many interesting plants to see.

Rushbrooke Farm is four miles from Boxford. Turn left from Chequers, taking the Lavenham Road out of Boxford. Keep following the Lavenham Road as sign-posted all the way (bearing right at Groton "Fox and Hounds", straight over the next crossroads, bear left just after straw bale stack, then right at T junction and almost immediately left at the large wood after one mile) turn right at Milden telephone box and signpost to Milden Church. Rushbrooke Farm is $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on left just past asbestos roofed barn.

The garden consists mainly of Trees, Shrubs and Roses.

There will be a Plant Stall at the Farm and also tea, so please bring a contribution in kind.
