Saturday 8th April. Coach trip to Stowe Landscape Gardens and Evenley Wood Garden, Brackley, by kind permission of Mr. R. T. Whiteley. The gardens at Stowe are the birthplace of English landscape gardening, a supreme creation of the Georgian era. Evenley Wood Garden is a 60-acre mature woodland garden with many bulbs, magnolias and early rhododendrons. Coffee and biscuits (at a charge of £1.00 per head) will be available on arrival at Stowe, before a guided tour of the gardens. We will remain at Stowe for lunch. Please bring a picnic. Admission to Stowe Gardens is £3.80 if not a member of the National Trust. There will be a charge of £2.00 per person at Evenley Wood, to be donated to the church. The cost of this outing will be £8.00 to include coffee at Stowe and entrance at Evenley Wood but not at Stowe. There will be a charge of £1.50 for NGS and the British Legion will arrange cream teas at a cost of £1.50 per person.

Saturday 17th June at 11.30 a.m. Visit to three gardens in Cambridgeshire: Docwra's Manor, Shepreth by kind permission of Mrs. John Raven, a $2\frac{1}{2}$ acre garden full of choice plants in a series of enclosed gardens.
